ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

ALAMANCE CO., C.S.C.

IN RE: INTERMITTANT JAIL SENTENCES

THIS MATTER is appropriate for entry of an Administrative Order as it affects all of the Court Division of Judicial District 15-A (Alamance County). By authority of North Carolina General Statute §7A-146 and pursuant to the directives of the North Carolina Supreme Court and consultation with Senior resident Superior Court Judge, D. Thomas Lambeth, Jr. it is hereby Ordered:

IT APPEARING TO THE COURT that on March 10, 2020, Governor Cooper declared a state of emergency and recognized that the "NC DHHS recommends for "Mass Gathering Events" that the event organizers, in part: (1) Urge everyone who is sick not to attend, (2) Encourage those who are at high risk, not attend, (3) Find ways to give people more physical space to limit close contact as much as possible, and (4) Encouraged attendees to wash hands frequently.

IT APPEARING TO THE COURT that on March 12, 2020 Alamance County Sheriff's Office has restricted visitor access to the Detention Center effective immediately.

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED that:

1. Effective immediately Alamance County Superior and District Courts will temporarily suspend intermittent jail sentences/split jail sentences that typically occur on weekends.
2. Probation and Parole Officers shall reschedule any intermittent jail sentences/split sentences and not schedule any such sentences until after May 1, 2020.
3. This order shall remain in effect until May 1, 2020 unless modified or terminated.
